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# LRIP Program – General Overview

- LRIP is governed by §86.31 Wis Stats., Trans 206
- LRIP is designed to address:
  - Seriously deteriorating roads under local jurisdiction
- It is an improvement program, not for maintenance or new construction
  - Project design life: at least 10 years
  - Projects must be built to appropriate standards
    - Towns: Trans 204
    - Cities & Villages: FDM 11-20-01
    - Counties: Trans 205



# LRIP Program – General Overview

- LRIP is a reimbursement program
  - Awards allow for up to 50% of eligible costs (except LRIP-S)
  - Project must be completed and contractor(s) paid before reimbursement
- LRIPWeb
  - Web-based program management system – enhanced in June 2020
  - One-time registration into TAS and LRIPWeb: <http://tas.wisconsindot.gov>
  - Core hub for LRIP project management – new project applications, project changes and reimbursement requests



# LRIP

## 2024-25 Program Overview - Updates

- Budget Updates
  - LRIP Entitlement - \$37,903,600
  - LRIP Discretionary - \$36,359,200
    - \$32,179,200 (2024-25 State Budget Allocation)
    - \$4.18 Million (Approved by the State Legislature for CTH O, Richland County)
  - LRIP Supplemental - \$100,000,000



# LRIP Program

## LRIP-Supplemental (LRIP-S – TRIS, MSIS, CHIS)

- 2023-2025 State Budget
  - Allocated \$100 million for additional investment in local roads
  - LRIP-S will continue to be managed through LRIPWeb
  - Timeline: coincide with LRIP-Discretionary (TRID, MSID, CHID)
    - Incoming discretionary applications will be considered for either an LRIP-D or LRIP-S award automatically, unless specified that only a higher cost share will be accepted
    - Projects can only receive 1 award
    - Statewide Review Committees will score and recommend funding for awards
  - LRIP-S will have a maximum 90/10 cost share; LRIP-D will have a maximum 50/50 cost share

# Agricultural Road Improvement Program (ARIP)

- New program authorized in the 2023-25 Biennial Budget
  - \$150 million dollars to be awarded in the 2023-25 Biennium
  - Projects may be reimbursed at a maximum 90% state/10% local cost share
  - The legislation requires that the department “prescribe a simple and clear application process” through the development of “an application that does not exceed 2 pages in length” (may streamline with electronic LRIPWeb format which will not exceed 2 pages when pdf’d)
- We are currently examining the legislation and anticipate ARIP application materials being released in early CY 2024
